<p style="text-align: center;">Week 3 - Friday 26<sup>th</sup> January</p> <p>Pattern: where '-er' and '-est' are added to words ending in 'y'  <i>happier, happiest, angrier, angriest, tidier, tidiest, funnier, funniest</i></p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Week 4 - Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> February</p> <p>Pattern: where '-ing' is added to words ending in 'e'  <i>shining, joking, hoping, smiling, surprising, loving, writing, coming</i></p>

<p style="text-align: center;">Week 1 - Test on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> February</p> <p>Spelling pattern - words where '-er', '-est', and '-ed' are added to words ending in 'e'  <i>nicer, writer, baker, loved, largest, closest, safer</i></p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Week 2 - Test on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> March</p> <p>Spelling pattern - Words where '-ing' is added to single syllable words  <i>running, clapping, sitting, wrapping, slipping</i>            NB. If a word ends in a consonant +y, we swap the y for an i before adding -ed</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Week 3 - Test on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March</p> <p>Spelling pattern - Words where '-ed' is added to single syllable words  <i>dropped, napped, ripped, dragged, poked, waved, rotted, jogged, fried, cried</i></p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Week 4 - Test on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> March</p> <p>Spelling pattern - Words where 'a' makes an /or/ sound before 'l' and 'll'  <i>all, ball, call, fall, small, walk, talk, always, also</i>  <i>To show that something belongs to someone or something, we add an apostrophe and add an 's'</i></p>
<p>Week 5 - Test on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March</p> <p>Spelling pattern - Words where 'o' makes an /u/ sound  <i>some, done, other, mother, brother, nothing, money</i></p>
